Covid-19 has taken a toll on mountain top experiences at Overlook. Camp has lost significant user income as retreat groups (Emmaus included) have cancelled and are waiting for a healthier environment, free of the pandemic. Though the income has dried up, the expenses continue for protecting and maintaining the facility. (The waste water treatment plant and other utilities run 24/7 regardless of use.)

The camp has graciously forwarded our earlier security deposits to the future Emmaus dates which has spared our community significant expense.



Serve on a Board? Who, me!? The Emmaus Board is different from many. It is family! Your brothers and sisters willing to help out to make sure we have Emmaus leadership and experiences. Without these volunteers there would be no Emmaus Walks, Gatherings, and Agape! They are the ones who figure out how to handle pandemics and other unexpected surprises as well!

Volunteers for the Board serve a 3 year term and generally manage one of the various work areas. You can see who is currently serving and how at (click on position)

Meetings last generally about 30-45 minutes following a Gathering. Contact the Community LD for more info or to place your name (or a friend's) in nomination.

God's transforming presence shapes us when we gather with other believers. Sharing with trust and charity we discover new insight, experience accountability and grow in hope and faith. You experienced this with your table group on your Walk and you can continue to experience it through a reunion group.

We are presently forming some new reunion groups in various localities and are seeking an individual in each area who would serve as a leader.

- The leader facilitates the small group of 4-7, working out meeting site(s), times, etc.
- The group commits to meeting at least 6 times from September to March. They may choose to meet more frequently and longer if preferred.
- The group centers their sharing around points on the group reunion card (given on your Walk.) Replacements can be provided.
- Meetings can convene around a meal if desired.
- Meetings generally run from 1 to 2 hours

Host a Gathering for the Community in your own backyard!

Our Emmaus community spreads over a very large area. The drive to attend a Gathering can take a couple of hours depending where it is. Why not invite everyone to come to you! **Get Started!**

1. Consult with local Emmaus Folk in your area to recruit help and determine the best days and times to offer your Local Hosted Gathering.
2. Organize a leadership team with people to cover the following roles. Your team may be larger but should not be smaller.
 - Gathering Director (over all coordinator)
 - Music Director - Spiritual Director
 - Refreshment Director - Child Care Volunteers (2)
 - 4th Day Speaker (10 minute sharing/witness how God is moving in their life.
 - You may add others as needed
3. Contact Shenandoah Valley Emmaus's Community Lay Director, to request being put on the schedule We like to move to different regions from month to month rather successive Gatherings in the same region'
