Inflation Hits Emmaus

After several years on minimal increase, Overlook fees jumped 20% this year and are scheduled to climb another 6% in 2024. Upper Room Emmaus raised pilgrim fees from \$12 to \$25. After struggling with how to manage the added expense, the SVEC Board projects the following after the current walks: Sponsor fee: 175 Pilgrim application fee: \$50 Team fee: \$185

To help individuals with these fees the following will be available:

Team fee: 1/2 scholarship on request

Sponsor fee: **Sponsor Partners Club**- Sponsor Partners sign up to help sponsors that need it! Participation form on-line or request to be mailed! Offerings from Candlelight & Gatherings will help fund scholarships.

She ended up having to leave a couple of items behind. As she walked away, the person right behind her told the cashier to put her remaining groceries on his tab.
